Wave (Waverley) Harris – During the period of war he was in the RAAF based in Scotland. His plane took off over the North Sea and disappeared. It is still unknown whether it was shot down or ditched. Missing in action.

Fred Bryant – went to Brisbane Grammar School too – then moved to Victoria

Mervyn Major – Neil – youngest of 3 brothers Leonard and Raymond (Raymond was in navy based in Sydney when Japanese subs entered Sydney Harbour. He was a survivor of The Kuttabul' which was torpedoed)

Graham Glendinning – lived on the corner of Ekibin Rd and real St. Worked as accountant in Townsville.
Was regarded as a fair cricketer.

Betty See – was of Chinese extraction and was friendly with Elva Gunn and at about age 18, they both married American Servicemen. Her older brother Fred, occasionally drove her to school in a smart MG roadster.
Her other brother, Roy See, became a member of Rotary in Hervey Bay.

Ron Noonan – son of Felix Noonan, secretary of the JPSS Committee for some time
