### NOTES

George McGregor – an only child, lived in Hislock Terrace, Annerley. He and Alan Adsett shared aviaries as an interest, as well as tennis. Was employed by the BCC at one stage.

Walter Fisher – son of JPSS headmaster, T.G. Fisher. Walter was the youngest of four. Brother Noel was physically handicapped. Walter, at one time was the industrial chemist at Bulimba Breweries and then Cairns. His older sister, Thea? was a piano teacher

Maurice Green – two older sisters Edna and Ivy, and Alan Adsett and Keith Scott played tennis at Hyne's Court at Moorooka.

Arthur Jackson - only bloke at school that Alan Adsett ever fought with. There were two fights – cause unknown

Robert Brown – became a Baptist minister then went to Melbourne in charge of radio broadcasts for the church and then television

Douglas McCullough – lived on corner of Young St and Annerley Rd. Joined the RAAF and was killed in a bombing raid over Europe

Eric Muir – Alan recalls Eric being called home from school because his father had collapsed dead in their front yard

Merv Cotterell – father was the postman, Bert. Merv's older brother was a 'Rat of Tobruk' and taken prisoner in Italy.

With others he escaped to Switzerland where a Swiss family took care of him til the end of the war. He returned to Brisbane then and married Eileen Yates. He suffered from emphysema.

Douglas Bruschweiler – father was manager of Websters Bakery at Boggo Road Jail

Tom O'Sullivan – lived in Venner Road - came to JPSS from Mary Immaculate Catholic school

Jack Manttan – lived in what was Alice St renamed Ponsonby Street

Stephan West (?), - died aged 15 or 16 from 'water on the brain'

Alex Alban – lived in Riverview Terrace behind the picture theatre. His father was a motorman on the trams.
