### NOTES

Fred (‘Chippy’) Holland- youngest of 3 – Daisy and Ronald – lived in mansion-like house named ‘Ilford’ on Ipswich Rd  
two houses north of Junction Terrace which later became function rooms ‘Moomba’.  
Father was proprietor of an international trucking company  
There was a tennis court. Chippy acquired a pony (13.2 hands) called ‘Grey Girl’ from his  
friend, Ossie Castle. Chippy dressed the part for competitions at Rocklea Showground.

One year at training for the RNA, Chippy broke his leg and his friend Ossie rode for him.  
Chippy’s dad must have bought him a sulky, which ‘Grey Girl’ managed well.

Stewart Cameron –went to Churchie – very quiet and clever  
Jack Groves – good cricketer

Ernie Fitzgerald – 7 children – Harry, Maurice, Ernie, Leslie, Eric, Dorothy and Joan
